Dear Class of 2023,

Although I taught many of you in middle school PE and coached some in basketball (undefeated team—good job!), I *really* got to know your class personality when you were in 10th grade. Through the project you had to do in your Comparative Government class, I was able to see your passion, your sense of justice, your compassion for others, your desire to stand up for those who cannot raise their voice or who have no voice, and your love for your classmates. It has been a joy to see you continue to develop these characteristics, using them to make a difference through CAJ organizations or clubs at school and in the community around us, despite the limitations due to COVID. I'm so glad that you were able to see a bit of normalcy this year before you head out into the world.

In my first year as high school principal, I wrote a letter to the senior class using characters (Harry, Ron, and Hermione) from one of my favorite books, *Harry Potter*. The following year I talked about the hardship I had gone through when my father passed away, and last year I used one of my favorite children's books, *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*, that I read to my kids and still read to the kindergarten class each year. This year, I thought it was fitting to incorporate manga, which I know many of you enjoy as much as I do.

Some of my conversations with you have started with "What's your favorite manga?", a question which is really hard for me to answer. I don't know if I have an all-time favorite, but I definitely know what type of stories I like. Interestingly (or not), it somewhat relates to the books I listed above. Some of the manga I've really liked and can re-read and still cry over are: One Piece, Naruto, ハイキュー, My Hero Academia, アオアシ, and 進撃の巨人. They all vary in the struggles the characters go through (無個性), the games or tournaments they win or lose (全国大会), the villains they face (ヴィランレン連合), or the ultimate goal they are pursuing (俺は海賊王になる!). What those manga have in common is that they are about the relationships between characters and the way they overcome whatever challenges are in front of them, similar to the other books and themes I mentioned. This is what I enjoy: seeing how these characters grow and overcome together.

It's the people you surround yourself with that matter, whether that is where you work, in your community, or in your home. Those relationships you build are what will help you get through life and all that it has to offer. ルフィーcan't do it without ブロ; デクcan't do it without 一年A組、ヒナタ can't do it without 影山 ... and you also can't do it alone. God called us to be in community with him and with each other. Find good people to surround yourself with: people you can fight with, fight for; work with, work for; love with, love for...that is my prayer for you as you leave this place.

Know that you are always welcome here and in Texas! Looking forward to seeing all the great things you will do in the world!
